Pre-Anesthetic Blood Test

We will perform a full physical examination on your pet before anesthesia. However, not all health issues are apparent on physical exam. Pre-anesthetic blood work is performed to detect any infection, anemia, or problems with organ function (such as liver or kidney problems). For this reason we recommend it for all anesthetic patients, but it is **required for all patients** <u>over 7 years of age</u> or those with <u>known health concerns</u>. Results are immediately available and you will be notified in the event of abnormal results.

Home Again Microchip

Microchipping is recommended to allow lost or escaped pets to be identified quickly and returned to their owners. The microchip is implanted via needle under the pet's skin. A scanner is used to read the microchip numbers and verify ownership of pets that are found and brought into an animal shelter or veterinary clinic.

Intravenous Fluids and Blood Pressure Monitoring

Anesthesia can cause a drop in blood pressure (hypotension). Hypotension decreases blood flow to vital organs. With prolonged hypotension, permanent tissue and organ damage can occur. Intravenous fluids help maintain normal blood pressure and allow rapid treatment in emergency situations. For this reason we recommend intravenous fluids and blood pressure monitoring for all anesthetic patients, but it is **required for all patients** <u>over 7 years of age</u> or those with <u>known health concerns</u>.
